What information is required on the transport documents?

The following information – in English and legible – is required to fully complete a transport document.

- 1. Consignor's name and telephone number.
- 2. A description of the dangerous goods including:
 - a. United Nations number (UN number)
 - b. The proper shipping name, or the name of the goods which appears on the packaging or receptacle
 - c. Dangerous goods class or division
 - d. Subsidiary risk (if applicable)
 - e. Packing group (if applicable)
 - $f. \hspace{0.5cm} \hbox{A description of each receptacle, eg 'drum' or 'intermediate bulk container' (IBC)}.$

Much of the information should be available from the package label, safety data sheet (SDS) for the product, or from the product's supplier, manufacturer or importer.

- 3. The number of packages or receptacles of each type.
- 4. The 'aggregate quantity' of the goods. This is the total quantity in litres and/ or kilograms of each separate type of dangerous good being transported. At all times the aggregate quantities shown must reflect the actual quantities currently on the vehicle. It must be updated as dangerous goods are unloaded from the vehicle. (This does not apply to tank vehicles transporting class 2 gases).

Exemptions to Placard Load Amounts	When is a licence required?
The above does not apply to: - Retail distribution loads complying with the ADG Code 7.3 - Fumigated units that do not contain other dangerous goods.	A licence is required when transporting any receptacle with a capacity of more than 500 litres or which contains more than 500 kilograms of dangerous goods.
	The exception is when intermediate bulk containers (IBC's) with a total capacity of up to 3,000 L are being transported, as long as they are not filled or emptied while on the vehicle. The vehicle must be covered by a dangerous goods vehicle licence and the driver must hold a dangerous goods driver licence.

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
